Discussion questions:

1. What point of view is the book written in?
2. Who are the main characters? What are their goals, and what conflicts do they face?
3. What is the setting?
4. Summarize the book (what happened in the beginning, middle, and end).
5. How does the author use irony?
6. What is reverse psychology? How do you see it being used in this story?
7. The book is called *Do NOT Turn This Page*. Do you think the author wants you to turn the pages in the book, or not? What leads you to your conclusion?
8. Who do you think the caller could be? What makes you think that?
9. What do you like about the book? What don't you like about it?
10. What are some other books you can think of that are written in second-person point of view?

Writing prompts:

1. Write your own "Do Not" (or "Do") story. Keep it fun and positive. Possible characters could include siblings, friends, pets, wild animals, even inanimate objects.
